It is hoped that this will be a formality and that works can commence some time in March or April.

### Serving the local community...

The Parish Council purchased additional daffodil bulbs from Barnsley MBC and Councillors planted these in the Autumn so watch out for these as spring beckons.

We have also recently written to the Highways Service at BMBC to complain about the frequency of accidents at Fullshaw Cross Crossroads. This is the second time the Parish Council has made representations about this location.

Did you know that parts of Langsett (A616) have been declared an Air Quality Management Area because of the levels of Nitrogen Dioxide along the route caused by the heavy usage of HGVs? BMBC have recently attended a meeting to tell us all about this and what they are doing to research the issues as well as discuss what, potentially, can be done in the future to combat the levels of Nox. Clearly as a main A route for HGV's it isn't going to be easy, but if you have any suggestions, we would like to hear from you. We ourselves have written to BMBC with some suggestions and will stay in close contact with them as this issue unfolds.

### **Your Parish Precept**

Parish Councils raise a precept each year, a 'levy' that is then paid to them by the Borough Council and added to Parishioners' main Council Tax bills. For at least ten years, Langsett Parish Council has maintained their precept at a very low rate, with a Band D property paying less than £10 per year. This is the lowest precept in the Borough out of 17 Parishes. It is with deep regret that, in order to ensure the Parish Council operates within its legal duties and responsibilities, the precept is increased for the year 2013/14. This means that a Band D property will now pay £33.93 per year an increase of £24.29. This will seem like a big increase, but across the year, equates to an extra 47p per week. Hopefully, put like this, it will not seem so severe.
